PERMITTED ITEMS, BARRED ITEMS AND DRESS CODE

Candidates will be subjected to extensive and compulsory physical checking before entering the examination centre.

PERMITTED ITEMS

- (a) Admit Card & School Identity Card / Govt Photo Identity Proof (For Pvt Candidates)
- (b) Stationery item i.e., Transparent Pouch, Geometry/Pencil Box, Blue/Royal Blue Ink/Ball Point/Gel Pen, Scale, Writing Pad, Eraser, Analogue Watch, Trans-parent Water Bottles and Hand Sanitizer 50 ml.
- (c) Metro Card, Bus Pass.

BARRED ITEMS

- (a) Any stationery item such as textual material (printed or written), bits of papers, Calculator (Candidates with Learning Disability i.e., Dyscalculia are permitted to use Calculator as per Circular No. CBSE/COORD/2020 dated 20.1.2020), Pen Drives, Calculator, Log Table (shall be provided by the centres), Electronic Pen/ Scanner, etc.
- (b) Any communication device such as Mobile Phone, Bluetooth, Earphones, Microphone, Pager, Health Band, Camera, etc.
- (c) Other items like Wallet, Goggles, Handbags, pouches, etc.
- (d) Any eatable item opened or packed, except for diabetic candidates
- (e) Any other item which could be used for unfair means.
- (f) Use of above or similar items will be treated under UFM category and will attract punishment as per rules.

11. Instructions for the Candidates

- 11.1 Candidates are permitted to carry following items: -
 - 11.1.1 Hand sanitizer (50ml.) in transparent bottle.
 - 11.1.2 Mask to cover the face
 - 11.1.3 Hand gloves only on hands
 - 11.1.4 Transparent water bottle for their personal use
 - 11.1.5 Admit Card, School Identity Card
- 11.2 Candidates will cover their nose and mouth with mask.
- 11.3 Candidates will follow social distancing norms strictly.
- 11.4 Candidates will carry their own drinking water.
- 11.5 Candidates will not exchange or lend articles.
- 11.6 Candidates will use safe mode of transportation for coming to the examination centre and returning back home.
- 11.7 Candidates will follow all instructions displayed in school and communicated to them.
- 11.8 Candidates should try to avoid contact with unknown persons.
- 11.9 Candidates will throw used tissue/ face mask into closed bins immediately after use.
- 11.10 Candidates will maintain good hygiene in toilets during and after use.
- 11.11 Candidates should not touch eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
- 11.12 Candidates will not shake hands or hug at any cost while greeting.
- 11.13 Candidates will refrain themselves from spitting in public places.
- 11.14 Candidates will seek advice on COVID from their parents while coming to appear for the examination.

12. Instructions for Parents

- 12.1 They should ensure that their ward is carrying pocket hand sanitizer in transparent bottle, hand gloves, transparent drinking water bottle and only other permissible stationary items only while going to the examination centre.
- 12.2 They should ensure that their ward has covered nose and mouth with face mask.
- 12.3 They should guide their ward to follow social distancing norms strictly.
- 12.4 They should instruct their ward not to exchange or loan articles.
- 12.5 They should ensure that their ward uses safe mode of transportation for going to the examination centre and returning back home.
- 12.6 They should instruct their ward to follow all instructions displayed in school and communicated to them.
- 12.7 In case their ward is not feeling well, they should consult the doctor and act as per the advice given by him.
- 12.8 They should instruct their ward to avoid contact with unknown persons.
- 12.9 They should instruct their ward to throw used tissue/ face mask into closed bins immediately after use.
- 12.10 They should guide their ward on the other important guidelines issued by Government of India to avoid spreading of COVID-19 and to protect themselves.
- 12.11 All stakeholders will follow other guidelines issued by Government of India from time to time
